Dear Margaret and Santo,

We went to Washington DC, August 1963, and stood with all the people to hear Martin Luther King's "Dream", which became everyone's dream that day. We do fault ourselves for not including our sons.

Then we went to the banks of the Potomac to feast on our fried chicken and we, the people, were much amused together. For there were police boats puttering up and down the Potomac searching for riots.

We watched on TV day and night at the endless long days of the committee to decide to impeach Richard Nixon, together with all of the people, watching that congressional committee and their multi lawyers argue and settle on the Articles of Impeachment.

We all grew entranced with Senator Erwin, calm, cool, collected with his pocket copy of The Constitution of the United States, always at the ready for instant confirmation of constitutional fact.

We joined with Susan and Barry and, all the people, across the country, and wrote postcards to every member of the House and Senate, recounting our reasons for impeachment. When they wrote us to tell us who our representatives were in Congress we replied "In matters of such gravity as impeachment you represent all of the people".

With All of the People, we have spent 8 years watching the eroding of our Bill of Rights, our loss of face before all the people of the world, the conduct of an illegal war and the elimination of the Geneva Conventions.

And then in the midst of our angst...

We heard Senator Barack Obama speak at the Democratic Convention of 2004, who spoke to, all the people, with such belief and hope and inspiration and faith that together we were one, we were committed to this shared dream.

But it was his last sentence that pierced my soul..."God Bless the United States of America!"

In our society of acronyms, using the fewest words possible, he reminded us ... That's us, that's the Constitution, that's what we are.

*Ansley & Kelly Carnahan lived in the East Village on 8th Street between Aves. C & D for 33 years. **The Firemen's Garden** adjacent to their building honors the memory of NYC firefighters who were killed in the line of duty. This site pays homage in particular to the memory of Martin R. Celic, a member of Ladder Company 18 who lost his life fighting a fire in the tenement that once stood there. The Carnahans had begun gardening in the lot next to an abandoned building in 1975. After the burnt-out building was condemned and torn down, they & other local residents expanded their garden to the new lot. Marty Celic's family donated the benches. In Aug. of 1996 the garden was granted "official" NYC Parks Dept. status. Ansley & Kelly now live in Vermont & recently celebrated their 50th Anniversary.
