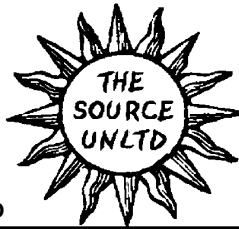

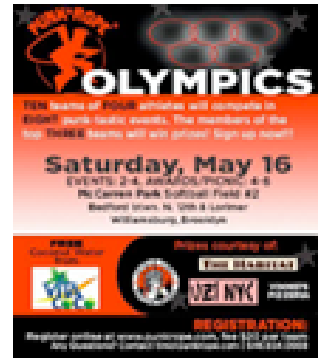
Gold medalists: The Swine Floozies
